

RDA Illawarra has collated and analysed the COVID-19 jobs impact data on a fortnightly basis, using ABS and ATO Payroll data for the past 19 months. Monthly webinars were held in September and October to explore the story behind the numbers. These 30-minute brisk briefings graphically review the impact on Illawarra jobs and industry, including:

- industry sectors impact
- job winners and losers
- exploration of the job trends
- impact on commuting.


Picton Road Submission advocates for dual carriageway

The duplication of Picton Road, along with the connecting Mount Ousley Interchange project, are both part of the Illawarra Shoalhaven <u>City Deal</u> project, coordinated by RDA Illawarra.

As part of the City Deal, RDA Illawarra have advocated for Picton Road to be a full four-lane divided highway for 24 kms along with improving the interchange at the bottom of Mount Ousley and widening Mt Ousley Rd from the University of Wollongong to Picton Road.

In November 2020, the NSW Government announced \$44 million to plan for an upgrade of Picton Road between the Wilton Growth Area and the M1 Princes Motorway.

Transport for NSW are now developing strategic options which can be used to identify and prioritise a program of work. See our submission to Transport for NSW on the proposed Picton Road upgrades here.





Port Precinct and investment attraction continues

- RDA Illawarra has continued to work proactively on optimizing the highest and best use of the Port Industrial Lands and Precinct. We have continued conversations with land owners, the Greater Sydney Commission and Transport for NSW.
- In July, we welcomed the ruling by Justice Jagot of the Federal Court that dismissed the ACCC's case against the NSW Government & NSW Ports Pty Ltd. The case alleged provisions in the Commitment Deeds were anti-competitive. The judgement by Justice Jagot makes it clear that Port Kembla will be the second Container Terminal for NSW, a win for Port Kembla's growth, freight efficiency and reliability of supply chains in NSW.
- BlueScope Steel achieved Critical State Significant Infrastructure status by Minister for Planning for the \$700-\$800 million No. 6 Blast Furnace reline project at Port Kembla. This project is important to the economic future of the Illawarra region, and beyond.







Successful Mentor Engagement for Leadership Illawarra Program

The 2021 LIP Mentor Program was launched in May with a training session and meet and greet event at Inside Industry.

The <u>Leadership Illawarra Program</u> cohort are fortunate to gain access to a diverse group of highly experienced mentors and business leaders through the LIP Mentor Program.

In September, a joint online celebration was held with JCI Illawarra who delivered a similar program, MentorMe for a group of junior Illawarra leaders.

Positive feedback was received from mentees on the ways the program has helped them to learn and grow as leaders:

"it has provided an opportunity to discuss issues and gain fresh insight into how to deal with them in an open and professional environment. I have been challenged in the way I think."

Mentors also report benefits from the program:

"my mentee is an extraordinary young man, and I once again enjoyed the opportunity to learn from him".
