

Wollongong City Deal progresses

The last two months have been exciting and productive for the City Deals initiative, with the renaming of the project to **Illawarra-Shoalhaven City Deal** which now increases the City Deal Collective to include four LGAs. 40 stakeholders agreed to a list of regional projects at a Consensus Workshop in March, resulting in the overall Illawarra-Shoalhaven City Deal now comprising over \$500M of transformative projects for the region.

During March, Debra Murphy (CEO RDAI) and Tania Brown (COO SMART Infrastructure Facility) undertook a benchmarking visit to Geelong, Victoria.

We were welcomed warmly by Geelong Council, Regional Development Victoria, Deakin University, RDA Barwon South West, G21 and the Committee for Geelong. We learnt a lot from the experiences of Geelong, who have secured billions of dollars for regional development initiatives, including Faster Rail and a City Deal. There are many similarities between Geelong (regionally) and the Illawarra. We are grateful to Geelong for openly sharing their experiences and learnings with us.





APPROVED - Port Kembla Gas Import Terminal Modification

Support the capability of our existing industry and development of growth industry sectors

The Modification of the Development Consent for Port Kembla Gas Import Terminal has been approved by the NSW Government.

This is great news for the Illawarra region, and will see further activation at the Port of Port Kembla (berth 101). Furthermore, this is great news for NSW as it provides a way to secure NSW with 70 petajoules of natural gas supply from 2022.

We look forward to the commencement of this vital energy project in Port Kembla.
